CPPC Updates

Mollie Scott Decat/CPPC Coordinator: Two mini grants awarded. Strengthening Families in Crawford County and Got Your Back in Sac County. JCO funds Board can decide to fund additional or up current mini-grants. Updates shared with the group related to CPPC funding, strategies, policy practice.

Crawford County Child Abuse Prevention Council (PCA)

FY 19/20 grants have been announced. Crawford County received funding for Parent Education/Family STEPS in the amount of \$43,977.00. The program will be provided by Crawford County Home Health, Hospice & Public Health. Sexual Abuse Prevention did not receive funds. Crawford did not appeal the decision.

Reviewed contract language related to the Council.

- Contractor shall maintain Volunteer Child Abuse Prevention Council or Coalition.
- Council shall meet regularly.
- Council shall be comprised of multi-disciplinary committee, including representation from required memberships. Reviewed list of required members from each of the disciplines listed. Education and/or Early Childhood Education, Annette Koster/David Brown; Public Safety or Law Enforcement, Glen Barngrover; Child Welfare, Mollie Scott; Medial and/or Mental Health, Amy Hull/Kim Fineran; Domestic Violence/Sexual Assault Advocacy Services, Amy Hull/Cynthia Banda; Substance Abuse Services, Jonathon LaPaglia; Parent Participation, Emmalee Bolin/Sara Roberts. Reminded everyone they are a part of the Council, input is needed from a variety of sources.

Available to provide A-SAMS and full evaluations, Play Therapy, Trauma, EDMR, goal to have everyone trained. Sara Edholm - school grant to serve non-insured as well as therapy in school. Turning Point has 8 to 9 bed crisis home that provides mental health services. 24 hour mental health care before need for in patient care is needed. Need a provider referral, professional, have to go through substance abuse screening, interim structure, therapist, psychiatric service connect with outside service. Emmalee Bolin Parent Partner: Mentoring 6 in Crawford County. Coordinator hired in Council Bluffs. Upcoming training Building Better Future, recruiting possible Parent Partners. Services lacking for families continues to be transportation.

Dawn Luetje LSI- Foster Care/Adoption: Completed Denison class, 1 home added in Crawford County. Shortage of Foster Care especially in Crawford County. Carroll class in July. Dawn sent an email with attachments, asking to assist in spreading the word on the need for Foster Care, include in mailings, employee letter, and post flyers.

Jodi Holm West Central Community Action: Crawford Memorial Hospital holding can drive. Governor releases that cannot longer fund fans/air conditioning without a doctor's order, order specify number of units needed. Community Action – Crawford County Outreach has a new flyer: LIHEAP, Energy Crisis Intervention Payments (ECIP), Emergency Food Pantry Referral, Emergency Clothing Room, Special projects: Good Fellows Holiday Program, Back to School Supplies, Temporary Aid Program, information and referrals. ECIP helping with utilities shut off – 10 days from shut off. Safe Link free phones, limit one per household. LIHEAP Oct 1st call to make appointment. Food Stamps call 800 number, able to work, but don't have a job. Have 3 months then done. Not able to apply for another year. TAP at Crawford County Courthouse. Hunger Fighters usually order 100, last time 60 utilized. Head Start taking referrals. WIC doing well.

Ivy Nielsen West Central Community Action: Senior Employment Program, 55 plus. Looking for someone for Outreach Office. If know of anyone unemployed willing to do job searches. Looking for host agency.

Jen Macke, Crawford County Home Health, Hospice & Public Health -HCCCMS: i-smile is a gap filling service. Provide preschool, daycare education/screening/ fluoride varnish, second and third grades provide sealants over 40% free and reduces rate. Denison & Boyer Valley schools. Must have parental consent. Deltal Dental grant able to provide child screenings and varnishes to childcare this summer. New newsletter –dental providers and physicians. Water fluoridation data (send to Annette K for email distribution). Contacting medical providers to check mouth at appointments, can bill for service. Able to offer services to help find dentist, application for Assumptive Eligibility.

Wendy Love, Crawford County Home Health, Hospice & Public Health –Child Care Nurse Consultant: In process of training. Welcome!

Jonathon LaPaglia Jackson Recovery: Prevention program short staff. Worked with IDPH to implement media campaign, with unspent funds, Talk You Can Hear. Dr AlTo was involved with education to parents on substance abuse campaign. App to how to talk with kids. Three different fact sheets: underage drinking, binge drinking, substance use. New pamphlets work do with substance grant and gambling.

Hidden in Plain Sight mock bedroom filled with items in teen bedroom. Is a tool designed to help parents with what to look for/identify. Request from community for information on Juuling. On news included local interviews. It is a vaping device looks like memory stick, popular with teens, put together presentation, get into schools. Juuling has a new form of nicotine, that approximates to more addictive than other vaping devices.

Child Psychologist – children comfortable with Dr Pike, assist with mediation management, talk to parents, curbside service, and care coordination. Family Navigators are parents they have like experiences with the families they serve. Research study Spark Genetics link for autism, bringing research to Carroll office. Parent’s special health care needs four months, community project health care needs to advocate for children.

Part of their application included Business Investment Program and Provider Development, one choice is to move funds to those programs.
