III. BV County Prevent Child Abuse Council (PCA)

a. Program Updates

1. Parent Education Family Steps: Janet G presented the Family STEPS program has 39 families enrolled with PCA and BVCS Early Childhood funds. They have had 3 new referrals. Increase serving families who speak Karen, 8 on caseload with 6 needing interpreter. Janet and Tiffany will be attending the PCA Conference next week. The program has also started the re-credential process for the Family Support Credential. Monthly reports are submitted to PCA Office.

2. Sexual Abuse Prevention: no representation present from CASSA. Annette K reported monthly reports are submitted to the PCA office. Pam B reported monthly billing is sent to Public Health. Public Health completes the Gax for the Council and submits to PCA office for payment.

b. Prevention Magazine/Insert: Annette K shared the Sac County Magazine Insert that was published by the Sac Sun for Sac County. She is working with the Storm Lake Pilot Tribune Dana Larson. Paola Michel will take the articles and have them translated for a Spanish paper. Please send article that would relieve the stress in a family's life to Annette Koster by April 29th. An email has been sent out with examples and word counts. When she has gathered the article she will copy them onto a cd and take to Dana and Paola. Newspaper ads will pay for the cost of the magazine/insert. Currently one article has been submitted.

Lori Hayung with ISU Extension & Outreach had been asked to make the ACE presentation to schools. Request to bring back the Paper Tigers viewing and discussion. Collaboration between CPPC and ISU Extension & Outreach to investigate purchasing the DVD.
- Lemonade for Life will be held on May 16, registrations are still being accepted. Curriculum is an excellent way to continue the ACE conversation with families. Curriculum materials reviewed and provided to be able to use following the training.
