Crawford County Child Abuse Prevention Council Update

Discussed activities for April prevention messaging/activities. Have one full box of pinwheels available.

- Proclamation with County Supervisors, invite 5th grade class to participate in reading the proclamation, provide each student a pinwheel, and notify newspaper of event for photo opportunity.
- Newspaper supplement, contact Gordon Wolf at the Denison Review, encourage agencies, schools, churches etc to write and provide an article. The article should focus on the program, support to families/children, the supports provided that help to prevent child abuse.
- Fundraiser at Pizza Ranch. Message on table tents with pinwheel on the tables. When bussing tables talk about the significance of the pinwheel, and programs in Crawford County that assist families and/or prevention programs. The program that attend the Coalition in one way or another have a prevention component. It may be helping learn interviewing skills for jobs to group based parent education classes.
- Color Contest: distribute to children during your work example Family STEPS clients, Common Sense Parenting classes. Display at Court House or Pizza Ranch. Collect prizes: I-smile toothbrushes etc...
- Display of pinwheels "garden" have signs. Attract attention, stop read, to bring awareness.
- Place blue and white sups in fence spell out message ribbon on tree.
- Radio station and /or newspaper interview

<u>Bailey Hill, Child Care Consultant, CCR&R</u>: DHS Training Registry will be renamed I-Power. It is a place to register for trainings being offered. A class is being offered to learn more about I-Power. DHS offers Mandatory Reporter Training only available on-line.

Manning child care is working on roof repair.

Schleswig no Registered child care providers.

Business Investment Program (BIP) available to home providers/center. Three start up centers awarded funds.

Looking for a CPR and First Aid class in Spanish. Working with a potential Registered Child Care Provider, this is the last step she needs to be a Registered Child Development Home.

<u>Vicki Snider, Rosecrance - Jackson</u>: Waiting for IDPH to put out deliverables. 480 interviews for assessment, qualitative assessment coming. Currently down a prevention specialist, hiring, provide education in schools. Offering Community Ed one hour starting 3rd Thursday in Denison at Jackson starts at 5:30 pm open to public.

CDB bottles finding high levels of lead. Illegal in Iowa to sell unless dispensed by dispensary. Available on-line, tanning salons testing positive for fentanyl, pesticides, chemicals, cannabis. If on blood thinners throws off.

<u>Darla Peterson, IDPH</u>: Prevention needs assessment will end 12/20/19 \$25.00 Amazon Card, call/text to get survey code, can't be people living with HIV. Want to identify gaps. Phone number 515-204-8773. Tele programs PREP pill get through tele prep – opioid overdose and URI. Free, have on hand, self-explanatory, website, mist Narcon, available through SAMSA grant. Jackson trains.

Paulette Lingle, Crawford County Home Health, Hospice & Public Health, 1st Five: Work with doctor and encourage screening (Ages & Stages Questionnaire or ASQ) during appointment. ASQ done at variable intervals. No cost to doctor/families. When contacted by doctor with concern, 1st Five, works to connect families to resources.

- CCHHH&PH offers free HIV testing, dates posted, twice a month.
- Family STEPS provide assistance to parents, help with applications to services.
- Wendy Love serves as the Child Care Nurse Consultant supports day care with health and safety needs.
- Maternal Child Health see before delivery, assistance support, referral to proper agency.
- Care for Yourself provides mamo, Pap smear for women with no insurance.
- Lead test, nurse follows up when notified.

Jodi Holm, West Central Community Action - Outreach: LIHEAP – Energy Assistance one time money goes off utility bill. Protects from shut off, get ahead this time of year. Need 2018 W2 paycheck to show proof of income. Goodfellow cut off Nov must bring proof of income, distributing on Thursday food/toys. Had 73 children sign up. Police Department also provides a program if they missed Goodfellow deadline. Clothing room free, coats, available.

<u>Ivy Nelson West Central Community Action</u>: Senior Aid accepting applications for 55 and over. Meet income guidelines and willing to work. Employers can be non-profit, government pays, contact Ivy.

Louise Galbraith, Rolling Hills Mental Health Region: Mental Health Admin for 20 years. Eight County Region. July 1st Regions take over the Children Behavioral Health, non-funded mandate. Working and meeting with stakeholders to develop plan to coordinate services (no funding). Severely emotional services, children doctors tend not to label, funding level 500% of poverty level, physiatrist diagnosis, working with mental health centers to define assessments. Child Health Specialty Clinic, mobile response must live in all 8 counties, Siouxland Mental Health Region wide in November. Going through law enforcement first dispatched to right area. Schools go directly to school, triage, several calls, can transport, refer to Turning Point, extended be in ER, Jackson Recovery stabilization, fund therapist in school, list of providers and agencies, meeting Thursday in Holstein.

<u>Kendal Esteves</u>, <u>Lutheran Services in Iowa – Foster Care</u>: Foster Closet in need of supplies, having a "drive" to collect different items, hang flyer and/or talk to promote.

Orientation 2-18-2020 in Ida Grove 6:00 pm. Foster Care Class in Ida Grove need a minimum of 5 households/10 to hold class.

Orientation 3-19-2020 in Sac City at 6:00 pm.

Denison Orientation Class in May class will be in Carroll.

Encourage relative foster care providers to go through orientation and class for full benefits.

Making welcome packets for new Foster Parents need information to give, kit for each county.

Mollie Scott, Decat: Decat program for Crawford County School Based Mental Program with Plains Area Mental Health is going well.

Immersion 101 training is schedule April 7th at the ISU Extension office, please mark your calendars. Board Meeting January 29th for Fiscal Year 2021.

<u>Dave Muhlbauer</u>, <u>Crawford County Supervisor</u>: Budget time, higher than normal. State/Federal funds drying up. Changes from state levy taxes 2% more hearings to finalize budget. Work on department budgets.

Mike Bunde, BVCS Early Childhood Iowa, Board Member: Listen to know what is going on and what is critical in the community.

Glen Barngrover, Juvenile Court Officer: JV Drug Court seeing marijuana usage/paraphernalia, not much opioid. Diversion currently inpatient need treatment less in detention.

Annette Koster, BVCS Early Childhood Iowa: The State Early Childhood Iowa has applied for an extension for the Preschool Development Grant.

Question from a Member, to the Members: Who in Crawford County does suicide prevention? Mental Health Practitioners (Plains Area Mental Health) and schools work together for counseling following event. Boys Town has a mental health hotline.
