Narrative:

Low-Income Preschool Support (LIPS) applications were lower in general this year. Funds are still avaiable. Following the "Tool" gudinance families that fell at or below 160% of the Federal Poverty Level were asked to apply for Child Care Assistance (CCA). Some families have had successful CCA applications. The amount they receive from CCA has been or will be deducted from the LIPS amount.
